

Grammar Nouns

A noun is used to refer to a **person**, **place**, **animal** or **thing**.

1. Student (**person**)
2. Park (**place**)
3. Cat (**animal**)
4. Cycle (**thing**)

Nouns can be **countable** or **uncountable**.

Countable Nouns (can be counted)		Uncountable Nouns (cannot be counted)	
pen	car	oil	water
boy	bag	sand	curry
house	key	dust	rice
cat	plate	ink	paper

Can be used in the following ways.

<i>a large number of</i>	cows	<i>a large amount of</i>	curry
